

2008 Erik Axel Karlfeldt Memorial Open

Round 7

1. His website's FAQ wonders which Bible character he's most like, and on it he plugs his eponymous Family Foundation and work with Christian colleges. Techniques used in his most famous match include an underhanded serve; high, slow shots; and an unusual return position that forced the double-fault that completed a 5-set comeback win. After defeating Ivan Lendl despite leg cramps, he defeated Stefan Edberg in the final to become the youngest winner of a Grand Slam title. He lost to Thomas Muster in the 1995 French Open final and was runner-up to Boris Becker and Pete Sampras in two Grand Slams in 1996. FTP, name this winner of the 1989 French Open, perhaps the most famous tennis-playing Chinese-American.
ANSWER: Michael Chang

2. The track "Brother Trucker" appears on a James Taylor album of this name. A song about one of these of a certain color begins "A year in the hole had taken its toll when I took a good look at me," and notes that one of these was "on my morning." In addition to that song by King's X, a song about one of these features the line "there goes a raven and there go the ribbons." That song appeared on *Gordon* before "If I Had \$1,000,000." In a song which says "if you live by the rules of 'it's over' / Then I'm sure that that makes sense," the singer insists that there will not be a white one of these above her door and that she will go down with this ship. FTP, name this thing sung about by Dido, whose black variety names a Henry Rollins punk band.
ANSWER: a flag (accept black flag until *Gordon* is mentioned, since that Barenaked Ladies song is just called "The Flag")

3. In one work from a director of this nationality, Luci and his girlfriend Sorina go to her father's grave to look for a sign of what to do after becoming homeless. In addition to *Occident*, another film from this nation features Eva, who is expelled from school and decides to travel to Italy with Andrei. *The Way I Spent the End of the World* was released in 2006, the year after the release of a film from this nation about a retired engineer who lives alone with his three cats before spending a horrible night travelling from hospital to hospital. *The Death of Mister Lazarescu* and Cristian Mungiu's *4 Months, 3 Weeks, and 2 Days* are among the films—FTP—created by directors from what nation, whose cinema has also produced *12:08 East of Bucharest*?
ANSWER: Romania (accept word forms like Romanian)

4. This product was named for a horse owned by the family that created it, and one ad for it shows a woman eating one in front of a horse, who responds by eating her head. Some variants of this foodstuff are the Flapjack version and the Charged version, which includes taurine. This used to be the sponsor for Ricky Rudd's #88 car, but it has more recently sponsored Kyle Busch, and Busch used it as his primary sponsor in his win in Atlanta in March. A recent ad for this candy features a group that includes a Viking, a pilgrim, and Henry VIII singing "Greensleeves" on a road

trip. It has used the slogan, “Hungry? Why Wait?” FTP, name this Mars-made candy bar consisting of chocolate, nougat, caramel and peanuts, which “really satisfies.”

ANSWER: Snickers

5. **This game saw the losing team score only one touchdown, which came on Tony Krepfle’s fourth quarter catch. This game saw the record for interceptions in a Super Bowl set when Rod Martin had three. The halftime show was a “Mardi Gras” festival, while the pregame show was about the end of the Iran Hostage Crisis. The postgame saw Pete Rozelle present the Vince Lombardi trophy to an owner who sued the league for stopping his team from moving earlier that season. Jim Plunkett was MVP of this Super Bowl with three touchdown passes, compared to one for Ron Jaworski. FTP, identify this game which featured the first Wild Card Super Bowl champion, in which the Raiders defeated the Eagles 14 years after the Packers defeated the Chiefs to win the first Super Bowl.**

ANSWER: Super Bowl XV

6. **He published an analysis of Gibbon’s *Decline and Fall* in the journal *Classics, Ireland*. His first solo album features a cover of “China Girl” and the song “Sister Midnight.” Besides *The Idiot*, a self-titled 1969 album with his original band featured songs like “Real Cool Time” and a song where this man sings that he wants to “lay right down in his favorite place” like the titular animal. Even better known is a song referring to “Johnny Yen coming with the liquor and drugs,” where “having it in the ear” inspires the titular desire. FTP, name this “Godfather of Punk,” the former lead singer of the Stooges who sang “Lust For Life.”**

ANSWER: Iggy Pop (or James Newell Osterberg, Jr.)

7. **A 2003 TV movie which told the “unauthorized story” of this starred Bret Anthony and Melanie Deanne Moore. In addition to *Behind the Camera*, it caused controversy when Nick at Nite censored an episode in which a male character’s scrotum was visible. A later season of this show introduced a farm girl named Cindy, who left to attend UCLA, though she was replaced by a nurse named Terri Alden. More central characters include used car salesman Larry Dallas, who lives upstairs, and the manager of the Arcade Flower Shop, Janet Wood. Also featuring Ralph Furley, the Ropers, and Jack Tripper, FTP, name this sitcom in which John Ritter pretended to be gay so he could share an apartment with women.**

ANSWER: Three’s Company

8. **On this character’s home improvement show he recommends covering everything in gold leaf. He caused an uproar when he asked for a travel destination based on smell, and received a pamphlet for Pittsburgh. His presidential campaign declared that he is on pot. He believes in “Dogbert’s Theory of Evolution” and his mother’s name is Tricky Woo. He is disgusted when he learns fish eat bugs, presuming that they eat monkeys, and he desires to eat a monkey himself. His nemesis is named Fungo, and he has been called a “feline triathlete” by his owner’s friend Joe. FTP, name this cat, the main antagonist of Rob and Satchel in *Get Fuzzy*.**

ANSWER: Bucky Katt

9. He is listed as executive producer for 2001's *Good Advice*. He appears in an uncredited cameo as a drummer in *Dune*, while he appeared as himself in two Rodney Dangerfield films, *Meet Wally Sparks* and *Back by Midnight*. He is given a "blue cheese cookie" in a dream sequence in the film *Snow Dogs* while floating in the album cover of his *Time, Love and Tenderness*. In his best known appearance in film, he is called a "no talent ass-clown" by a man who says "why should I have to change my name if he's the one who sucks?" FTP, identify this singer of "When a Man Loves a Woman," referenced repeatedly in the film *Office Space*.

ANSWER: Michael Bolton

10. A 2001 documentary whose title refers to *this man's* "brain" focuses on his illness and death, which stopped his work on a film version of *Don Quixote*. His work is featured in the trailer for *Be Kind, Rewind*, while that same movement of a string quartet backs the first five minutes of *The Royal Tennenbaums*. The piece he's best known for was used in 2006's *Cashback*, 2003's *Basic*, and 2002's *The New Guy*. That piece is also used during a disastrous sex scene meant to thank a character for saving the female's boyfriend from drowning in the ocean. The record skips, making George Webber stop intercourse with Jenny Hanley, played by Bo Derek. FTP, name this composer, known in pop culture for the use in the film *10* of his *Bolero*.

ANSWER: Maurice Ravel

11. The most recent draft pick from this school famously left his shoes on the court after his final game, and currently plays for the Timberwolves after being drafted by the Celtics. George Mason coach Jim Larranaga went to school here, while Rick Barnes coached here after leaving George Mason but before coaching Clemson. This team's conference, the Big East, was founded by a former coach and athletic director here, Dave Gavitt. In 2008, Tim Welsh was replaced as coach of this team by the coach of a surprising Missouri Valley team, Drake's Keno Davis. FTP, name this school led to the 1987 Final Four by guard Billy Donovan and coach Rick Pitino, known as the Friars.

ANSWER: Providence College (prompt on "Friars" before it is mentioned)

12. His first charting exposure was as a songwriter for the boy band Youngstown, including most of their album *Down for the Get Down*. Rumors that he was coming out of the closet in a forthcoming issue of *Essence Magazine* exponentially increased the buzz around his debut album, which featured songs like "Stay" and "Sexy Love" in addition to a hit about the singer's titular feeling about love songs on the radio. In 2008, he wrote Rihanna's hit "Take a Bow," and in addition to his album *Year of the Gentleman* he wrote and was featured in the popular Plies song "Bust It Baby." FTP, name this R&B singer of the current single "Closer," best known for the hit "So Sick."

ANSWER: Ne-Yo (accept Shaffer Smith, as if anyone will say that)

13. One attack on this discussed licking another person and saying the words "Mad Cow Disease." Another attack on this preceded a discussion of Jolyon Wagg's relation to Captain Haddock, while it has been argued that although this practice is

“awesome” in certain contexts, “Red Star Brigade” is bad. According to one authority, one thing that says *this* is a “giant stone head spewing rifles at a diaper-clad Sean Connery.” In response to an incident of it in 2008, one person allegedly spilled his drink after being pushed, after which that drink was thrown at another person. FTP, name this controversial phenomenon which led to increased awareness of the musical career of Lee Henry and provoked ire in the aftermath of previous Chicago Open trash tournaments.
ANSWER: meta quizbowl (accept equivalents)

14. **Bobby Lowe accomplished this feat in 1894, which resulted in money being spontaneously thrown onto the field. Three players have done it for the Phillies, the most of any team, though two required extra innings. Ed Delahanty and Bob Horner both did it in losing efforts while Mark Whiten did it after going 0-4 in the other leg of the doubleheader and still set a record for RBIs in a day. Mike Cameron did it while netting the fewest possible RBIs while Shawn Green fell a triple short of doing it and hitting for the cycle. Most recently, Carlos Delgado did it, victimizing Joe Kennedy, Lance Carter and Jorge Sosa twice. FTP, identify this rare baseball feat involving a certain number of run-scoring hits.**

ANSWER: hitting four home runs in one game (accept obvious equivalents)

15. **She’s not Anne Bradstreet, but she also wrote a poem with the line “Thunderfuck my mouth is shut / been a while feel like a cunt.” That poem appeared on the website she used to release singles like “Stripper Friends” and “Paralyze,” and discusses her emotional turmoil after she gave Kristy the final key instead of Bo, only to have Kristy refuse her. She is the former host of “Pants-Off Dance-Off.” Bobby Banhart was refused by her and was not given her phone number amid speculation that she wasn’t really bisexual. FTP, name this host of a reality show on MTV wherein male and female contestants try to win the titular “Shot at Love” with her.**

ANSWER: Tila Tequila (accept Tila Nguyen)

16. **His first group featured Braxton Schuffert on guitar and Freddie Beach on the fiddle. In one song, he lamented that “you’re afraid each thing I do is just some evil scheme” and wished that he could “free your doubtful mind and melt” the title object. In another song, he noted that he had seen the “crabs and the fishes” when he “looked down in the sea,” and lamented that he “can’t buy no beer.” In addition to “Cold Cold Heart” and “My Bucket’s Got a Hole in It,” he sang “Crazy Heart” after assuming the name “Luke the Drifter.” FTP, name this country singer who died of a drug overdose at the age of 29 in 1953, whose son of the same name is also a country artist.**

ANSWER: Hank Williams, Sr.

17. **This man discussed his temporary professorship at the University of Leipzig with Bill Simmons on *The BS Report*. He is currently working on his first novel, *Downtown Owl*, while his only other work of fiction is an unfinished novel about a woman falling from the sky onto a man’s car. His first work starts with a discussion of his purchase of the Motley Crue album *Shout at the Devil*. In one of his books he has an imaginary discussion with the three most important women in his life while discussing “Layla”; that book sees him visit the locations of the deaths of famous musicians. FTP,**

name this author of *Killing Yourself to Live* and *Sex, Drugs and Cocoa Puffs*.

ANSWER: Chuck **Klosterman**

18. **In a song of this name, the singer notes that he talked to the judge in private early this morning and then took him to the sheriff's office to sign a warrant, which will lead to a "false charge" being put against someone. In one episode of a TV series of this name, Dave Stacy grew a beard and studied the Qu'ran, while in another episode a programmer named Christopher went to India to learn about outsourcing. In addition to that series on FX, this two-word phrase appeared in the title of a comic book series by Steve Niles in which Eben Olemaun saves the town of Barrow from vampires. FTP, give this temporal phrase which describes a TV show hosted by Morgan Spurlock and, followed by "of night," a 2007 Josh Hartnett film.**

ANSWER: **30 Days**

19. **He was booed off stage in Madison Square Garden after playing country music, an experience which inspired his 1972 album *Garden Party*. His first musical foray, meant to impress a date, was a cover of Fats Domino's "I'm Walkin,'" and between 1957 and 1962 he trailed only Elvis and Pat Boone in chart hits. He released a single with the A-side "Travelin' Man" whose B-side featured his best-known song, in which greeting the titular female also means saying "goodbye heart." That song, "Hello Mary Lou," was re-released following his 1985 death in a Texas plane crash, and has been covered by his twin sons. FTP, name this early teen idol introduced through his parents' TV show, *The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet*.**

ANSWER: **Ricky Nelson** (accept **Eric Hilliard Nelson**; prompt on "Nelson")

20. **Nick Gregory plays the title character in a 1999 version of this work in which the title figure is "in Manhattan." Geoff Meech directed a 2005 version called *this "3000: This Time It's Personal"*. A 1979 TV version directed by Philip Casson featured Judi Dench, while Orson Welles starred in and directed a version that makes "The Holy Father" a bigger character. One of the best-known versions features a nude Francesca Annis during a sleepwalking scene, while another adaptation sees Washizu Taketori as a version of the title character. FTP, name this play adapted by Roman Polanski and made into *Throne of Blood* by Akira Kurosawa, a work with a bloody dagger and some Scottish people by Shakespeare.**

ANSWER: **Macbeth**

Bonuses:

1. The singer notes that he would like to "rest his weary head tonight" on a bed of the title objects. FTPE:

[10] Name this song, which also notes that the title objects "hang like grapes / On vines that shine."

ANSWER: **"California Stars"**

[10] A recording of “California Stars” appears on *Mermaid Avenue*, a collaboration between Billy Bragg and this group whose albums include *A Ghost Is Born*.

ANSWER: **Wilco**

[10] *Mermaid Avenue* consists of lyrics by this American artist, who wrote a song about the sinking of the *Reuben James* and the song “Pastures of Plenty.”

ANSWER: Woody **Guthrie**

2. They Might Be Giants won a Grammy for the theme song to this show, “Boss of Me.” FTPE:

[10] Name this long-running sitcom, which was originally a midseason replacement for *Futurama* and starred Bryan Cranston as the title character’s father.

ANSWER: **Malcolm in the Middle**

[10] Daniel von Baren played this character, who as director of the Marlin Academy was tormented by Francis; later, he followed Francis to Alaska and tried to kill him.

ANSWER: **Edwin Spangler** (accept either)

[10] This quiet younger brother of Reese and Malcolm was played by Erik Per Sullivan.

ANSWER: **Dewey**

3. MedicalHairRestoration.com has a “celebrity clients” page. Answer the following about people other than local radio personalities who appear on it, FTPE:

[10] This 2005 Baseball Hall of Fame inductee was a client. He played third base for the Red Sox, Yankees and Devil Rays.

ANSWER: Wade **Boggs**

[10] Also sporting his new locks on the webpage is this man who played second base for the Braves from 1988 to 1997. His three triples in the 1991 World Series tied a record.

ANSWER: Mark **Lemke**

[10] This quarterback was supplanted by Joe Montana at the 49ers, John Elway with the Broncos, and Steve Young with the Buccaneers, while he supplanted baldness with surgically-implanted hair.

ANSWER: Steve **DeBerg**

4. When Samuel is killed during World War I, his brother cuts out his heart so it can be sent home for burial. FTPE:

[10] Name this 1994 film, in which Samuel Ludlow was played by Henry Thomas.

ANSWER: **Legends of the Fall**

[10] In a 1990 film which was a prequel to a 1960 Hitchcock movie, Henry Thomas played the “young” version of this crazy dude.

ANSWER: **Norman Bates** (accept either)

[10] More recently, Thomas appeared in this 2002 film as Johnny Sirocco, who introduces his old friend Amsterdam to the film’s other major character.

ANSWER: **Gangs of New York**

5. Name these artists featured on Michael Arnold’s must-have album of the summer, the *Sex and the City* movie soundtrack, FTPE:

[10] It opens with “Labels or Love,” a track performed by this artist who had a huge if inexplicable success with her 2006 album *The Dutchess*.

ANSWER: **Fergie** or Stacy Ann **Ferguson**

[10] This Welsh singer, whose 2004 debut album was *Finally Woken*, contributed “It’s Amazing.”

ANSWER: **Jem** or Jemma **Griffiths**

[10] This artist, who sings “The Heart of the Matter” on the soundtrack, scored hits with such songs as “Brown Skin” from her debut *Acoustic Soul*.

ANSWER: India. **Arie** or India Arie **Simpson**

6. Answer the following about foods and drinks which have entire festivals devoted to them in California, FTPE:

[10] Every April, Stockton is home to a three-day festival dedicated to this vegetable. In the 19th century, the first amino acid to be isolated was derived from this.

ANSWER: **asparagus**

[10] In July, Gilroy is home to a festival dedicated to this. The festival elects a Queen of this product, whose task is to have a good time with “fellow lovers of the pungent bulb.”

ANSWER: **garlic**

[10] Paso Robles is home to a spring festival dedicated to this kind of wine. This is the second most planted red wine grape in California.

ANSWER: **zinfandel**

7. 1994 saw a strike that ended the baseball season on August 11. Answer the following about that season FTPE:

[10] When the strike occurred this team had the best record in baseball. Their manager, Felipe Alou, won Manager of the Year.

ANSWER: **Montreal Expos** (accept either)

[10] The AL Cy Young Award went to this pitcher, who had 16 wins for the Royals. While playing for the Yankees in 1999, he threw a perfect game.

ANSWER: David **Cone**

[10] The 1994 season saw three no-hitters, one of which was thrown by this Twin. He would be traded to the Orioles the next season.

ANSWER: Scott **Erickson**

8. This man’s football career saw him make four straight Pro Bowls as a Viking. FTPE:

[10] Name this host of *NBA Access* who is also a friend of Michael Jordan.

ANSWER: Ahmad **Rashad**

[10] Rashad also hosted the two celebrity editions of this reality show, currently in its fifth season on ABC.

ANSWER: *The Mole*

[10] In the second celebrity edition of *The Mole*, this woman was “The Mole.” A red-headed former model, she appeared as a clerk in *The Last Action Hero*.

ANSWER: Angie **Everhart**

9. It describes a crusade led by Frederic Wertham, who wrote the book *Seduction of the Innocent*. FTPE:

[10] Name this recent book by David Hadju, which also describes the foolishness of William Gaines in testifying before Congress about a certain scourge of America.

ANSWER: *The Ten-Cent Plague*

[10] Hadju's also wrote *Positively 4th Street*, which describes the "life and times" of this singer, her sister Mimi, her brother-in-law Richard Farina, and her lover Bob Dylan.

ANSWER: Joan Baez

[10] This 1973 novel was dedicated to Richard Farina, and includes parts titled "In the Zone" and "The Counterforce."

ANSWER: *Gravity's Rainbow*

10. In 2007, many musicians wore stupid sunglasses. Answer the following about that trend, FTPE:

[10] This rapper wears white-framed sunglasses with his name on the lenses. His best-known single refers to a dance named after himself.

ANSWER: Soulja Boy Tell'em

[10] Kanye West sports sunglasses with horizontal bars in the futuristic-looking music video for this 2007 song.

ANSWER: "Stronger"

[10] Calvin Harris wears honeycomb-shaped sunglasses on the cover of this album, his 2007 debut. Its title refers to the origin of a certain genre of much-reviled music.

ANSWER: *I Created Disco*

11. FTPE, name these television characters who are also serial killers.

[10] This title character of a Showtime series is a forensics expert for the Miami Police Department.

ANSWER: Dexter Morgan (prompt on "Morgan")

[10] This killer was revealed to be Quentin Costa in the third season finale of *Nip/Tuck*. He raped Christian Troy in the second season finale.

ANSWER: The Carver

[10] This killer from *The X-Files* had genetic mutations that made it possible for him to squeeze into tiny spaces. He also ate human livers every thirty years.

ANSWER: Eugene Victor Tooms

12. He's best known for choosing to kick and take the wind in an overtime game. FTPE:

[10] Identify this former head coach of the Lions, who himself was a quarterback at the University of Montana in the '80s.

ANSWER: Marty Mornhinweg

[10] Mornhinweg made that choice despite having this above-average kicker, who was drafted by the Lions out of Washington State in 1992.

ANSWER: Jason Hanson

[10] Mornhinweg is the current offensive coordinator for this NFC team.

ANSWER: Philadelphia Eagles (accept either)

13. Liza Ward's novel *Outside Valentine* is based on this man's life. FTPE:

[10] Name this man who, along with his girlfriend Caril Ann Fugate, began a killing spree in Nebraska in 1957.

ANSWER: Charles Starkweather

[10] The murders committed by Charles Starkweather inspired this remarkable 1973 film directed by Terence Malick, which starred Martin Sheen and Sissy Spacek.

ANSWER: **Badlands**

[10] Stephen King pays a tribute of sorts to Starkweather in this 1978 novel, whose main evil character Randall Flagg is said to have gone to school with him.

ANSWER: *The* **Stand**

14. The singer of this song “bought a toothbrush and some toothpaste.” FTPE:

[10] Name this song in which “the fruit of another” makes the singer feel the titular way.

ANSWER: “**Tempted**”

[10] “Tempted” was a hit for this band, who released it on the album *East Side Story*.

ANSWER: **Squeeze**

[10] Squeeze also released this song in 1982. In it, the singer remarks to his ex that “There is nothing of your love that I’ll ever miss.”

ANSWER: “**Black Coffee in Bed**”

15. He starred as lawyer Norman Kane in 1986’s *Armed and Dangerous*, in which his character and John Candy’s discover an embezzlement scheme. FTPE:

[10] Name this actor, who also created the ‘90s Canadian TV series *Maniac Mansion*.

ANSWER: Eugene **Levy**

[10] *Maniac Mansion* starred this actor as Fred. On *SCTV*, he played such characters as Count Floyd, while in *Happy Gilmore* he often calls the title character a “jackass.”

ANSWER: Joe **Flaherty**

[10] The theme song to *Maniac Mansion* was performed by this Canadian whose hits include “Calling All Angels.” In 2006, she gave away all of her possessions and changed her name to “Issa.”

ANSWER: Jane **Siberry**

16. This man scored a career-high 42 points in March 2004, a year after he helped the Spurs win their second title. FTPE:

[10] Name this NBA player, currently a small forward for the Golden State Warriors.

ANSWER: Stephen **Jackson**

[10] Jackson is perhaps best known for his role in the “Malice at the Palace” as a Pacer. He became a Pacer when he was traded for this player.

ANSWER: Al **Harrington**

[10] Jackson was drafted by the Suns, but played his first game with this team in 2000. They had drafted a Cincinnati product with the #1 overall pick that year.

ANSWER: **New Jersey Nets** (accept either)

17. Name these actors who appeared in Ang Lee’s *Hulk*, FTPE:

[10] Betty Ross’s father, the General, was played by this man who appeared as aeronaut Leo Scoresby in the recent film adaptation of *The Golden Compass*.

ANSWER: Sam **Elliott**

[10] David Banner was played by this actor, who memorably appeared as Adam Verver in the Merchant/Ivory version of *The Golden Bowl*.

ANSWER: Nick **Nolte**

[10] This actress, who played Kelli Moltisanti on *The Sopranos*, appeared as Edith Banner.

ANSWER: Cara **Buono**

18. In 2007 it added the “Watch Instantly” service option. FTPE:

[10] Name this company which reached its billionth delivery in 2007, ten years after it was founded by Reed Hastings.

ANSWER: **Netflix**

[10] In 2008 Netflix introduced a set-top box manufactured by this company, which delivers streaming video to a customer’s TV set.

ANSWER: **Roku**

[10] One of the first attempts to directly compete with Netflix was the “Movie Value Pass” created by this company, which was bought by Movie Gallery in 2005.

ANSWER: **Hollywood** Video

19. This band’s drummer Kenny Ortiz was once employed by Michael Arnold’s father. FTPE:

[10] Name this band that has released albums like *Onomatopoeia* and *Fight With Tools*.

ANSWER: **Flobots**

[10] Critics like Steven Feldman laud this lead single from *Fight With Tools*, a surprise hit for the Flobots.

ANSWER: “**Handlebars**”

[10] The Flobots also released an album named for this animal, which also names a prog-rock super-group; it is paired with Kant in the title of an Umberto Eco essay.

ANSWER: **Platypus**

20. This town is where the protagonist first encounters certain zombies, and also features booby traps such as rotating propellers. FTPE:

[10] Name this town which Gordon Freeman visits in *Half Life 2*, and which Alyx Vance tells him “We don’t go to.”

ANSWER: **Ravenholm**

[10] Ravenholm is the first level in which the player can attack enemies with this weapon, which can pick up and throw objects such as exploding barrels.

ANSWER: **Gravity Gun**

[10] This is the only human who lives in Ravenholm; he helps Gordon get through the town with the help of his rifle, Annabelle.
