

# 2008 Erik Axel Karlfeldt Memorial Open

## Round 9

1. He says he took a job at a Chicago Circuit City just because he wanted to, though others have speculated it was for an easy employee discount. He claims that he murders “cats like the Holocaust” and references his shoes by a nickname he once shaved into his hair. These claims come from “Fever,” the surprisingly great single from this man’s *My World*, an album once said to have sold only a single copy its first week. He’s the best player ever traded for Travis Best, though a taunting fan cost him \$5 million in lost salary, presaging his trade for Peja Stojakovic after a year-long suspension. FTP, name this “Tru Warier,” a troubled NBA defensive specialist who has played for the Bulls, Pacers and Kings.

ANSWER: Ron Artest

2. In the *Sly Cooper* video game series the “King” of this species often fights using fireworks. The website Cracked.com has declared this species “Nature’s Loser.” A boxy vehicle of this name comes in “Emotion,” “Dynamic,” and “Active Plus” varieties, and was the 2004 European Car of the Year for its manufacturer, Fiat. One cartoon describes the adventures of one of these creatures as the sidekick of Don Coyote. A third season episode of *South Park* in which Cartman sues Stan for sexual harassment has this animal’s name in the title. One of the five mascots for the Beijing Olympics, Jingjing, is one of these animals. FTP, name this species, of which Jack Black recently voiced a “Kung Fu” specimen.

ANSWER: Panda

3. They released a 2008 remix album which ends with the track “What We Do For You,” which is made up of messages left on this group’s Fan Phone. Their previous album came out in 2007 and featured “Looking for Strange.” In addition to that album whose title is a Hebrew word for chaos, *Tohuvabohu*, they released *Adios* in 1999, when they began a three-year hiatus. The song “A Drug Against War” appears on a 1993 album by this group which also includes a song which proclaims “our music is sampled / Totally fake / It’s done by machine cuz they don’t make mistakes.” That track, “Sucks” from the album *Angst*, notes that they hate Depeche Mode, which led to one interpretation of their name. FTP, identify this German industrial band whose name, which means “no pity for the masses,” is a five-letter acronym.

ANSWER: KMFDM

4. He collaborated with his wife Pamela on the book *The Cats in Our Lives*. He starred as Rafe Crompton in 1970’s *Spring and Port Wine*, while his other late roles include Eduard Seibert in *The Boys from Brazil* and Ed Concannon in *The Verdict*. He played teacher Ed Avery, who becomes addicted to cortisone, in *Bigger than Life*, while he twice appeared on screen as Erwin Rommel, including in 1953’s *The Desert Rats*. He also played Captain Nemo in *20,000 Leagues Under the Sea* and a spy named

Philip Vandamm who has a home near Mount Rushmore in *North by Northwest*. FTP, name this actor who starred as a pedophile in Stanley Kubrick's version of *Lolita*.

ANSWER: James Mason

5. According to medieval legend, the poet Virgil once balanced this city on an egg and built a market there in which the meat never spoiled. The basketball team located in this city plays at the PalaBarbuto and won the Coppa Italia in 2006, while its soccer team is known informally as "The Blues" and as "The Little Donkeys." In the 19th century, a song style associated with this city became popular, producing such well-known tunes as "Funiculi Funicula" and "O sole mio." One kind of dessert named for this city features blocks of chocolate, vanilla, and strawberry ice cream in the same package. FTP, name this Italian city which is said to be the birthplace of pizza.

ANSWER: Naples

6. On a website dedicated to this man, he claims to have never measured the size of his "rims, IQ or penis" while fans of him call themselves *his ninjas*. He disastrously attempted to be the first man to order pizza live on national television, while his other antics include eating dog food and having to be censored after calling Terry Glenn gay. All these occurred on one of his best-known venues, where he has a rivalry with a former colleague and a blackboard on which one-liners are written. On that show, he is second all-time in wins but first in early eliminations and mutes. FTP, name this former host of *Cold Pizza* and current panelist on *Around the Horn*, a columnist from the *Denver Post*.

ANSWER: Woody Paige

7. This adjective appears in the title of a song which asks "Is it a crisis or a boring change?" and which notes that "you can never quarantine the past." In addition to that song about this kind of "sounds," this is the second word in the title of a 1981 album by Gang of Four whose opening track was "Paralyzed." The lyrics "Thank you for coming home / I'm sorry that the chairs are worn" open a song of this name by Spandau Ballet, while the song "When the Stars Go Blue" appears on an album of this name by Ryan Adams. This is the last word in the title of a song about a man who has been to Hollywood and Redwood, and who crossed the ocean to find this kind of "heart"; that song appeared on the album *Harvest* by Neil Young. FTP, give this word which designates an element with atomic number 79.

ANSWER: gold

8. Greg Smith's book *Beautiful TV* analyzes the "art and argument" of this series. In this show's fourth season, one character was stalked by a homeless man named Mr. Bo, while another realized that she once slept with Jackson Duper, though he used a different name. In its final episodes, the title character went to Bermuda with Victor, and decided to move to New York to be with her daughter Maddie. The title character dated Brian Selig and Greg Butters, who was played by Jesse L. Martin. It featured Peter MacNicol and Greg Germann as John Cage and Richard Fish, partners in a Boston law firm. FTP, name this irritating TV series about a lawyer played by Calista Flockhart.

ANSWER: Ally McBeal

9. Donna Wilkes starred as Molly in an '80s movie of this name, which spawned several sequels starring such actresses as Betsy Russell and Mitzi Kapture. One character by this name is an alternate final boss for the video game *Tekken 2*. Another character by this name was originally named "Experiment 624" and is dating Stitch. When preceded by a certain adjective, this word names a short-lived James Cameron-created TV show starring Jessica Alba. The X-Man by this name is the son of Warren Worthington Jr. and has large wings. FTP, give this name shared by a vampire with a soul who used to date Buffy Summers.

ANSWER: Angel

10. At birth, her last name was Youmans, though she has been known as Amber Arpaio. She appeared in a video for rapper Mysterious, while her other musical endeavors include the singles "What We Want" and "Move Ya Body," which haven't been officially released. A loophole making it legal in Florida to film nude but non-sexual conduct by minors is at the heart of her lawsuit with Joe Francis, who promoted *Girls Gone Wild* footage of her after her sudden rise to prominence under the name Kristen. After traveling to the Mayflower Hotel in Washington, D.C., she was hired to meet a man known as "Client 9." FTP, name this hooker at the heart of the Eliot Spitzer prostitution scandal.

ANSWER: Ashley Alexandra Dupre (accept Ashley DiPietro; accept Kristen before it is mentioned; accept Amber Arpaio before it is mentioned)

11. Prior to 2007, it last took place in America in 1997, when it was located in Primm, Nevada. The first six also took place in America, including two at Magic Mountain. The most recent American winner appeared on an April episode of *Are You Smarter than a 5<sup>th</sup> Grader* and won \$25,000. That man was considered a favorite in the 2007 event held in Anaheim, but was defeated by 4-time winner Mariusz Pudzianowski. Before Phil Pfister, the last American champion was a man now seen alongside Todd Harris as a broadcaster, Bill Kazmaier. Nordic countries dominate, with multiple championships won by Jouko Ahola and Magnus Ver Magnusson. FTP, name this competition, a staple of daytime ESPN that crowns the titular male.

ANSWER: World's Strongest Man Competition

12. The cover to this singer's album *Fornucopia* featured him in a bowler hat above a woman's cleavage. He was born in Brisbane to an Olympic swimmer, and left Morningside High School to pursue a musical career. His first album, which came out in 1989, was entitled *Straight Jacket*. He was supposed to serve as the main character of the film *The Lamb*, but it was never released. His *Greatest Hits* album contained the songs "Way of the Girl," "It Don't Matter to the Sun," and "Lost in You." He appeared as the musical guest on an episode of *Saturday Night Live* which was hosted by the singer of "Friends in Low Places." FTP, name this fictional rock star, an alter ego of Garth Brooks.

ANSWER: Chris Gaines (do not accept or prompt on "Garth Brooks")

13. **The title character is eating cookies on the roof of a building with a nine-year-old boy, and spying on a friend of his who is sitting on a bench with the woman he loves, when those two characters are informed that a man has been murdered. The opening scene of this film is set on a small island off the coast of Scotland, while its closing scenes are set in Russia. The title character brings a corpse named Ivan back to life** in order to discover a certain tomb. That title character has to kill numerous incarnations of Sammael, an unpleasant hellhound, while pining for Liz Sherman, his pyrokinetic love. FTP, name this 2004 film in which the Ogdu Jahad almost destroy the Earth thanks to Grigory Rasputin, though they are foiled by the Ron Perlman-played and stone-armed title character.

ANSWER: *Hellboy*

14. **The Eskimo Zunari sells magic armor in this game, and Lenzo gives a character the picto box. The protagonist is attacked by enemies such as the shark-like Gyorgs and the plant Boko Baba, from which one can steal seeds with the grappling hook. In one level the protagonist is helped through by Makar and he must fight the worm-like Molgera.** In his quest to find his sister, Aryll, the protagonist meets members of the royal family, the King of Red Lions, and the pirate Tetra. FTP, name this Gamecube game, controversial for the use of cel-shaded graphics, detailing the adventures of Link in a watery Hyrule.

ANSWER: *The Legend of Zelda: The Wind Waker*

15. **Bill Russell had the first hit in this World Series, a RBI triple, though his team would go on to lose Game One in 12 innings. Steve Garvey batted .375 in this series, while the pitcher with the highest ERA for the winning team was Catfish Hunter, who had a 10.38 ERA. Game 6, which decided the Series, was won by Mike Torrez, who also won Game 3,** and the eventual series MVP hit three home runs. This series has been documented in the films *Summer of Sam* and *The Bronx is Burning*. FTP, name this World Series in which MVP Reggie Jackson led the Yankees to victory over the Dodgers, which was played during Jimmy Carter's first year in the White House.

ANSWER: 1977 World Series

16. **They recorded such tracks as "Visitor from Venus" on their second album for the Beatles' Apple label, *Space*, while their first album for that label featured the "Three Little Feelings" suite and the title track, "The Jasmin Tree."** After seven years off, they came back together in 1981 for the *Reunion at Budokan* album, while their more recent releases include *Echoes*. They covered a track by the young Ornette Coleman on their 1962 album *Lonely Woman*, while *Dedicated to Connie* paid tribute to their drummer Connie Kay. Originally known as the Milt Jackson Quartet, FTP, name this jazz group with such signature pieces as "Bags' Groove" and "Django" which is dedicated to playing contemporary music.

ANSWER: the Modern Jazz Quartet or MJQ

17. **Lesser known music associated with this show includes one cast member's cover of "Lean on Me" for the DVD of *Snow Buddies*, while another cast member charted with "I Don't Think About It."** Joey Fatone guest-starred as a washed-up baseball

**player, while Ms. Kunkle and Mr. Corelli are teachers on it. One result of this show is the formation of the band Metro Station: singer Trace is the brother of the star, while Mason is the brother of Mitch Musso, who plays Oliver Oken. Oliver's alter ego is rapper Mike Standley the Third, an identity chosen by the Emily Osment-played character Lilly Truscott, who doubles as Lola. FTP, name this TV series featuring a normal schoolgirl who becomes the titular rock star, a show starring Miley Cyrus.**

ANSWER: Hannah Montana

**18. He claimed that he uses "Highway to the Danger Zone" as his ringtone because he unironically likes the lyrics. His first game as a play-calling offensive coordinator resulted in a national championship, following an Orange Bowl win over Notre Dame. After playing wide receiver for Missouri, he worked as a coordinator under Bill McCartney. His successes include leading his team to a second-place spot in the AP Poll in 2001 after thrashing Nebraska and coaching a traditional doormat to the 1995 Rose Bowl. He notoriously called alleged rape victim Katie Hnida a "terrible" place-kicker. FTP, name this college football coach fired amid scandal in 2005 by the University of Colorado.**

ANSWER: Gary Barnett

**19. He recently asserted that the only reason he tolerates newborn children is that "he will need someone to date in 16 years." He appeared in a cameo role as Carlos in *Tomcats* and played TV host Adam Gold on *Married With Children*. Along with Larry Charles, he's heading production on the movie *Religulous* while his comedy specials include "I'm Swiss" and "Him: the Decider." He may be better known for a show that frequently features ridicule of 9/11 conspiracy theories, interviews with his incongruous friend Ann Coulter and the segment "New Rules." FTP, name this comedian, former host of *Politically Incorrect* and current host of *Real Time*.**

ANSWER: Bill Maher

**20. This artist wrote such songs as "Bulbs" and "You Don't Pull No Punches, But You Don't Push the River" for a 1974 album he put out following his divorce from Janet Rigsbee. In addition to *Veedon Fleece*, an album he released in 1979 features the songs "Full Force Gale" and "Bright Side of the Road." That album's title, *Into the Music*, alludes to the title of an earlier hit from this artist. Songs by this man which are named after early rock and roll figures include "Jackie Wilson Said" and "Domino," while his other works include the album *Astral Weeks*. FTP, name this artist responsible for songs such as "Moondance" and "Brown Eyed Girl."**

ANSWER: (George Ivan) "Van" Morrison

Bonuses:

1. Dolly Parton provides guest vocals on the track "Gold," while the album opens with "Shores of White Sand." FTPE:

[10] Name this album released in the summer of 2008, its artist's third released on Nonesuch Records and her first solo album since *Stumble Into Grace*.

ANSWER: ***All I Intended to Be***

[10] *All I Intended to Be* is the latest album from this country music singer, whose other albums include *Wrecking Ball* and *Pieces of the Sky*.

ANSWER: Emmylou **Harris**

[10] Harris collaborated on *Western Wall* with this singer, who won Grammy Awards for her Aaron Neville collaboration "Don't Know Much" and for her "tropical Latin" album *Frenesi*.

ANSWER: Linda **Ronstadt**

2. She appeared as a Female Armed Guard in 1999's *Muppets from Space*, and has recently been romantically linked with Steve Wozniak. FTPE:

[10] Name this actress, who memorably appeared as Lucy in the classic film *Shakes the Clown*.

ANSWER: Kathy **Griffin**

[10] Griffin starred as a restaurant critic named Vicki on this '90s sitcom, which centered on a San Francisco magazine called *The Gate*.

ANSWER: ***Suddenly Susan***

[10] This is the name of Griffin's reality TV show on Bravo, which won a 2007 Emmy for Outstanding Reality Program.

ANSWER: *Kathy Griffin: **My Life on the D-List***

3. Name these Duke graduates who have played in the NBA in the last few years, FTPE:

[10] This forward recently opted out of his contract with the Clippers and agreed to sign with the 76ers.

ANSWER: Elton **Brand**

[10] He was undrafted after leaving Duke early in 2005, though he signed with the 76ers. Michael Wilbon quoted him on John Amaechi as saying "As long as you don't bring your gayness on me, I'm fine."

ANSWER: Shavlik **Randolph**

[10] This forward who was drafted by the Blazers in the second round of the 2007 draft went to the Pacers as part of the Jerryd Bayless-Brandon Rush trade.

ANSWER: Josh **McRoberts**

4. The title character wants to be a reporter, and her family is compelled to turn their home into a boarding house during the Great Depression. FTPE:

[10] Name this 2008 film in which Abigail Breslin plays the title "American Girl."

ANSWER: ***Kit Kittredge: An American Girl***

[10] Kit's father is played by this man, who appeared as the titular sidekick in 1997's *Batman & Robin*.

ANSWER: Chris **O'Donnell**

[10] Kit investigates a series of robberies allegedly perpetrated by this kind of person. A 1977 Tim Conway film centered on Vernon Praiseworthy, a "billion dollar" one of these.

ANSWER: **hobos** (accept *The **Billion Dollar Hobo***)

5. She once listed *The Master and Margarita* as an influence on her music, which includes albums like *Debut* and *Vespertine*. FTPE:

[10] Name this singer from Iceland.

ANSWER: **Bjork** Guomundsdottir

[10] Besides Bulgakov, Bjork also claimed to have been influenced by this pioneering German band of *Computer World* and *Trans Europa Express*.

ANSWER: **Kraftwerk**

[10] Bjork interviewed this man, her musical idol, for the magazine *Dazed and Confused*. His works include *Mikrophonie* and a cycle of operas called *Light: the Seven Days of the Week*.

ANSWER: Karlheinz **Stockhausen**

6. He wrote about how the Scots-Irish shaped America in his book *Born Fighting*. FTPE:

[10] Name this author whose first novel, 1978's *Fields of Fire*, has been called the "best book about Vietnam."

ANSWER: Jim **Webb**

[10] In 2006 Webb defeated this Republican to be elected to a Senate seat in Virginia.

ANSWER: George **Allen**

[10] Webb also wrote the screenplay for this 2000 film in which Samuel L. Jackson plays a Marine colonel who is court-martialed after helping to evacuate an embassy.

ANSWER: **Rules of Engagement**

7. Answer the following about NASCAR brothers who aren't Kurt and Kyle Busch, FTPE:

[10] Kerry is the underappreciated half-brother of this man, NASCAR's most popular active driver.

ANSWER: Dale **Earnhardt Jr.** (accept just **Junior** but not just **Earnhardt**)

[10] They are the only brothers both to have won series championships: one brother did it in 1984 and 1996, the other in 2000.

ANSWER: Terry and Bobby **Labonte**

[10] Tim won two championships in the '50s and his brothers Bob and Fonty were successful racers for this family.

ANSWER: **Flock**

8. In addition to Arnold Schwarzenegger, Earl Boen was the only actor to appear in all three *Terminator* films. Answer the following about the man who played Dr. Peter Silberman, FTPE:

[10] You might remember him as Reverend Meechum from this '80s sitcom, whose "irascible" title character was played by Vicki Lawrence.

ANSWER: **Mama's Family**

[10] Boen appeared as Dr. Knoll in this 2000 film, which ends with the title character marrying Denise Gaines and features an odd episode involving Dean Richmond and a hamster.

ANSWER: **Nutty Professor II: The Klumps**

[10] Boen also provided the voice of Sam Gladstone, the owner of Lasky's Used Books, in *Double Helix*, the sequel to this video game which centers on the theft of nuclear weapons by Sergei Dekker.

ANSWER: **Soldier of Fortune**

9. Amelie Gillette produces such features as "The Tolerability Index" and "The Hater." FTPE:

[10] Name this website devoted to popular culture, whose other regular critics include Scott Tobias and Nathan Rabin.

ANSWER: The **A.V. Club** (prompt on "The Onion")

[10] The A.V. Club is home to this not especially amusing comic strip, which purports to come "from the secret files of Max Cannon."

ANSWER: **Red Meat**

[10] Also syndicated on the A.V. Club is this advice column, which is illustrated by cartoons drawn by Misako Takashima.

ANSWER: **Savage Love**

10. After Judith Traherne falls down a flight of stairs, she visits Doctor Frederick Steele, who discovers that she is dying of a tumor. FTPE:

[10] Name the 1939 film in which this takes place, which featured Ronald Reagan as Alec Hamm.

ANSWER: **Dark Victory**

[10] This actress starred as Judith in *Dark Victory*, and won Oscars in the '30s for her performances in *Jezebel* and *Dangerous*.

ANSWER: Bette **Davis**

[10] Though Bette Davis was nominated for an Oscar for her role in *Dark Victory*, she lost to this actress, who would win a second Oscar for playing Blanche DuBois.

ANSWER: Vivien **Leigh**

11. Name these artists who appear on the soundtrack to the film *I'm Not There*, FTPE:

[10] The title track is performed by this venerable alternative rock group, whose recent albums include 2006's *Rather Ripped*.

ANSWER: **Sonic Youth**

[10] "Stuck Inside of Mobile with the Memphis Blues Again" is performed by Charlyn Marshall, who has released such albums as *The Greatest* under this stage name.

ANSWER: **Cat Power**

[10] This singer and Calexico collaborated on a version of "Just Like a Woman"; she appeared as Claire in the film, and in 2006 released the mostly English-language album 5:55.

ANSWER: Charlotte **Gainsbourg**

12. Answer the following about figures from the world of sports, FTPE:

[10] This man is majority owner of both Manchester United and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

ANSWER: Malcolm **Glazer**

[10] This man, who also has the given name Malcolm, was recently hired as an offensive coordinator for the Ravens after a disastrous one year stint as NFL head coach.

ANSWER: Malcolm “Cam” **Cameron**

[10] Malcolm MacDonald was a notable player and coach for this Premier League team owned by Mohamed Fayed, which used a comeback on the last day of the season to avoid relegation.

ANSWER: **Fulham** Football Club (prompt on “The Cottagers”)

13. In its first season, all the members of the Metz family were murdered except for a child named Sofia, who is cared for by Alma. FTPE:

[10] Name this TV series, in which Alma’s husband was murdered by Dan Dority.

ANSWER: **Deadwood**

[10] All of those murders were committed at the direction of this character, the owner of the Gem.

ANSWER: **Al Swearengen** (accept either)

[10] The first season also saw the opening of this saloon/brothel by Cy Tolliver, who became Al’s chief competitor.

ANSWER: the **Bella Union**

14. Eric Clapton has been in a lot of supergroups. Identify some of them, FTPE.

[10] *Disraeli Gears* is the biggest-selling album of this supergroup that featured Jack Bruce, Ginger Baker, and Clapton.

ANSWER: **Cream**

[10] Clapton and Baker joined Steve Winwood and Ric Grech to release one self-titled album under this name.

ANSWER: **Blind Faith**

[10] Mitch Mitchell, John Lennon, Yoko Ono, Keith Richards and Clapton formed this group for the disastrous TV special “The Rolling Stones Rock and Roll Circus.”

ANSWER: The **Dirty Mac**

15. Name these organizations with which Wolverine has been associated, FTPE:

[10] Frank Miller invented this society of evil ninjas, who worship a demon known as the Beast. Along with Hydra, they brainwashed Wolverine.

ANSWER: The **Hand**

[10] Wolverine was deprogrammed by scientists working for this agency, whose first “known” director was Nick Fury.

ANSWER: **S.H.I.E.L.D.** (or **Supreme Headquarters International Espionage Law-enforcement Division**)

[10] Brian Michael Bendis created this group, which formed after Electro released some supervillains from the Raft. In one story about them, Wolverine, Spider-Man, and Spider-Woman took down the Wrecker.

ANSWER: the **New Avengers**

16. They finished 12-0 in 1998, but weren’t invited to a BCS bowl. FTPE:

[10] Identify this Conference USA team.

ANSWER: **Tulane** University

[10] This quarterback for Tulane set many records in college, but was disappointing as a starter for the Buccaneers in the pros.

ANSWER: Shaun **King**

[10] After Tommy Bowden left for Clemson, Tulane was coached in the Liberty Bowl by this man, their offensive coordinator. Recently, he was hired away from his Big East alma mater by a Big Ten school.

ANSWER: Rich **Rodriguez**

17. In his most recent book, *A Few Seconds of Panic*, he describes his experiences practicing with the Denver Broncos as a 43-year-old sportswriter. FTPE:

[10] Name this reporter for *The Wall Street Journal*.

ANSWER: Stefan **Fatsis**

[10] Fatsis is best known for this 2001 book about the world of competitive Scrabble players.

ANSWER: **Word Freak**

[10] Fatsis can be heard on NPR on Fridays talking about the business of sports with this woman, his wife. She became a co-host of *All Things Considered* in 2003.

ANSWER: Melissa **Block**

18. It is closely associated with Athens, Georgia, though it was founded in Denver by people from Louisiana. FTPE:

[10] Name this record label associated with acts like Of Montreal and the Apples in Stereo.

ANSWER: **Elephant 6** Recording Company (or Collective)

[10] Also associated with Elephant 6 was this band fronted by Jeff Magnum that released the album *On Avery Island*.

ANSWER: **Neutral Milk Hotel**

[10] This better-known Neutral Milk Hotel album centers on the story of Anne Frank, and includes "Two-Headed Boy."

ANSWER: ***In the Aeroplane Over the Sea***

19. Tim Robbins appeared in one episode as a novice who kills himself after being hazed, while Linda Hamilton had a small role as Joe Coffey's girlfriend. FTPE:

[10] Name this '80s TV series, which also featured such characters as Daniel Travanti's Captain Furillo.

ANSWER: ***Hill Street Blues***

[10] The later seasons of *Hill Street Blues* featured this actor as Lieutenant Norman Buntz; he went on to play Andy Sipowicz.

ANSWER: Dennis **Franz**

[10] Lieutenant Howard Hunter was played by this actor, who played FBI director Denton Voyles in *The Pelican Brief*.

ANSWER: James B. **Sikking**

20. Name these young superstars in baseball, FTPE:

[10] This infielder, the 2005 Cape Cod League MVP, was taken with the third pick of the 2006 draft, and made his major league debut on April 12 of this year.

ANSWER: Evan **Longoria**
